Milestone No. 68(71) is an original monument of 1767 at its original site, marking Mason and Dixon's 68th horizontal mile west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line, longest of their survey lines run and marked during their 1763-68 commission to define the boundary between the English provinces of Maryland and Pennsylvania. As with all original West Line monuments, this milestone was quarried and carved in England, of oolitic limestone, measuring about 12" square by about 4 1/2' long, with the base left rough-cut for setting into the ground. It is embellished with vertical fluting and horizontally-fluted margins on all four sides, with a low pyramidal top formed by fluted planes rising about 2" to a centered apex. The distinguishing features are the Roman capital letters P on the north side facing Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, each V-sunk into a plain shallow circle panel near the top. Reset in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary, No. 68(71) has since stood about 12" above ground, remains close to 12" square, is in very good condition, unaltered and comparatively protected. On the federal and state levels, it is significant primarily as one of the series of 135 original monuments still standing along the West Line, the boundary later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. Locally, as one of 18 original monuments marking the present Carroll/Adams-York county boundary (3 crowstones, 15 milestones), it is also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.

Milestone No. 68(71) marks Mason and Dixon's 68th horizontal mile west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line. It is an original milestone of 1767; in very good condition; unaltered; firmly set, having been reset in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary; and is in its original site, preliminarily surveyed in 1765; and comparatively protected from farm machinery and vandalism.

The area here is generally rolling, open farmland, sparsely settled. It is within Election District 3 of Carroll County, MD, Germany Township of Adams County, PA; about 2 miles southeast of the town of Littlestown, PA; about 2 miles northwest of the village of Silver Run, MD; in an open unfenced farm-field berm about 700' equidistant from the west side of MD 97 and south side of Georgetown Road (LR-0156); opposite the fourth telephone pole west from MD97. It can be seen from both roads when vegetation is dormant, but is far enough away from the roads that it is inconspicuous and apparently not vandalized.

As with all original Mason and Dixon West Line monuments, this milestone was quarried and carved in England, of oolitic limestone, measuring about 12" square by about 4 1/2' long, with the base left rough-cut for setting into the ground. It is embellished with vertical fluting and horizontally-fluted margins on all four sides, with a low pyramidal top formed by fluted planes rising about 2" to a centered apex. The distinguishing features are the Roman capital letters P on the north side facing Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, each V-sunk into a plain shallow circle panel close to the top. In 1902, during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey, No. 68(71) was reset to stand about 1' above ground, and surrounded below ground by a concrete collar to secure it in place. It remains about 12" square and close to 12" above this foundation; nearly all embellishments are clear and intact, although the top is weatherworn and all edges and top corners are chipped. The concrete foundation has been exposed on the north side from the wash from the upper field on the south to the lower-level north field, a drop that otherwise protected the monument from damage by farm machinery.

Milestone No. 68(71) is significant on the federal and state levels primarily as one of a series of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments still standing along their 230.228-mile West Line, later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. The site was preliminarily surveyed in 1765 and the monument set in 1767, where it remains in very good condition, unaltered, at its original site, although reset more securely in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Locally, it is one of 18 original monuments (15 milestones, 3 crownstones) still marking the present Carroll/York-Adams county boundary, and is significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.




