1751 Stone Chapel Road depicts a mid-nineteenth century house in a village. Its small stature is typical of the construction of houses in small towns. While the exterior has been modernized with aluminum siding and enclosed porches, you can still discern the original proportions of the log house on its stone foundation. The house is shown on the 1862 map, so it predates that year.
