

## 14 EAST GREEN STREET

The three bay wide two story rectangular plan building, number 14 East Green Street, fronts the south side of that street across from the Catholic Cemetery in Westminster. The building, which has recently received careful repair work, is a gem. The principal facade is characterized by woodwork nearly as fine as any in the City. The entrance door, the eastern ground story bay, rests in an elaborate surround. The door itself is a fairly plain many glass panelled door which is surrounded by side lights and a wide three light rectangular transom. This is surrounded by plain pilasters and topped by a heavy deep wooden cornice. The other five bays on the principal facade are finely proportioned 6/6 double hung sash windows. All windows have wooden sills, and will presumably be (again) flanked by louvered shutters, the marks of which are still apparent on the stretcher bond brick wall. The building was probably built c. 1875.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The three bay wide two story rectangular plan building, number 14 East Green Street, fronts the south side of that street across from the Catholic Cemetery in Westminster. This is surrounded by plain pilasters and topped by a heavy deep wooden cornice. The other five bays on the principal facade are finely proportioned 6/6 double hung sash windows. All windows have wooden sills, and will presumably be (again) flanked by louvered shutters, the marks of which are still apparent on the stretcher bond brick wall.

Windows on the ground floor are distinguished from those on the upper floor by the form the wooden lintels take. Those on the ground floor take the form of thick deep denticulated cornices, supported by end scroll brackets. Those above are rather less conventional, where the carpenter has sawed modified ogogee arches in the wooden lintel. Above all this, topping the facade, is a thick deep denticulated bracketed cornice which is a larger more elaborate version of the cornices topping the ground story windows. A wooden string course runs through the paired scroll brackets at their bases, creating, in effect, a brick frieze. The cornice itself continues all around the building in a simplified form, but without the brackets.

The east facade is blind underneath the gable roof of the section nearer Green Street (this house is typically built in two sections) except for a small four light attic window within the gable, to the south of the corbel capped brick chimney which rises flush with the wall at the gable roof's peak. Six over six windows, regularly aligned one per floor, light the west wall of the two story gabled roof rear section. The east wall of this rear section is sheathed in clapboard, and is lighted by pairs of windows on the second floor. A one story shed roofed addition extends on the ground floor and is lighted by 6/6 windows. The east facade of the front section is, like the west facade, blind but for a four light attic window; here however, the window is placed smack in the center.
