



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Samuel Price house and outbuildings are located close to the north side of Maryland Route 27, with a low hedge partially surrounding the house.

The house faces south to Route 27, with its gable roof aligned parallel to the road. It is 2 1/2 stories high on a high basement, with a corrugated roof and two brick interior end chimneys, the east one larger than the western one. The house is sheathed with concrete block.

The principal (south) facade is four bays wide, with a center cross gable which is sheathed with white fishscale shingles. This gable has a Palladian window with colored lights in the upper sash of its central arched window. On the second story are four 1/1 windows with flat block lintels, and on the first floor there is a transomed doorway in the second bay from the east, with three floor length 1/1 windows, two to the west and one to the east. A one-story porch extends along this facade and wraps around the east end of the house. It has corrugated roofing and is supported by Colonial Revival columns which are unevenly spaced.

To the east are two outbuildings of interest. Closest to the house is a log kitchen with west gable end entrance and shed porch; it is sheathed with white siding and has a brick interior end chimney. To the east of this building is a square building with a pyramidal roof, a slight projection on the south side containing large garage doors, and a doorway on the corner of the west facade.

This is probably the S. Price property shown on the 1862 Martenet atlas of Carroll County, and as Samuel Price on the 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson atlas of the county.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is of interest for its four bay wide form, a characteristic house type in Carroll County building, which is combined with a variety of materials and motifs from a variety of late nineteenth century architectural styles. These elements reflect the picturesque eclecticism of nineteenth century architecture, and are vernacular interpretations of current fashions, often applied inaccurately and incongruously. The use of concrete block is unusual in the area, and is especially interesting here because it is combined with Queen Anne patterned shingles and colored lights which add to the textured surface of the concrete block, but which are not usually used with it. These elements are then incongruously combined with elements of the Colonial Revival, the Palladian window with unexpected colored lights, and the porch, which is asymmetrical and has unevenly spaced columns, surprising in the Colonial Revival style. The presence of the earlier outbuildings, especially the log kitchen building, adds to the significance of this interesting complex.
