DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Neuwinger House is located south of Manchester, on the west side of Maryland Route 30. It faces east and is set on land which slopes down slightly from the road. The house is of brick construction, two stories high and three bays wide, and is gable roofed, with the ridge parallel to Route 30. It has a standing seam metal roof and two brick interior end chimneys.

The principal facade contains, on the second floor, three 6/6 windows with white wooden lintels and dark shutters. On the first floor, a central doorway is flanked on each side by a similar window. A one-story shed roof porch, with a standing seam metal roof, extends along this facade, supported by four square posts. The south gable end is blank, with no openings.

On the west side is a one-story, white, gable roofed ell, perpendicular to the main block, with a shed porch on its south side, both covered with standing seam metal roofing. To the west of this ell is another gable roofed structure, with its ridge parallel to that of the main block of the house.

This house is probably the D. Neuwinger property shown on Martenet's 1862 atlas of Carroll County, and that of D. Neinger on the Lake, Griffing and Stevenson 1877 atlas of the county.
