Summary paragraph:

The house has been greatly altered since the 1980 MHT survey. The two-and-a-half story structure is now sheathed in frame and modernized.

Description

House (1850-1875)

While the 1980 MHT survey identified this structure as possibly log, alterations have made it impossible to confirm this observation. The house is 2-1/2 stories, three bay by two bay with modern frame siding and thermal windows. The asphalt shingle gable roof is parallel to the road and there is an interior brick chimney on the east gable end. A garage has been added to the west elevation and a shed to the north elevation. An open wood porch is located on the principal [south] facade.

8. Significance

Summary paragraph:

Constructed circa 1850-1875, the Schneehagen House is no longer representative of its former rural vernacular farmhouse style due to alterations.

History:

Located on the north side of Water Tank Road, east of Maryland Route 30 and Manchester, the Schneehagen House is no longer representative of a nineteenth century rural vernacular farmhouse. The house is probably the G. Homer Farm on the 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson Atlas.

Evaluation:

Constructed circa 1850-1875, the Schneehagen House is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property is not eligible under Criterion A; no significant events historically or agriculturally have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion B; no persons significant in local, state or national history have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion C; the house has been extensively altered to a point where original fabric is no longer extant and except for the brick chimney, exterior architectural details have been obliterated.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small 2 1/2 story gable-roofed house is sheathed in asbestos shingle and faces south. Fenestration of the principal facade is irregular, and suggests that the building was constructed in at least two stages. On the first floor, four irregularly spaced bays contain an entrance in each of the two central bays, with 2/2 sash windows outlying them. The second story is pierced by three 2/2 windows, the westernmost of which is not aligned over an opening on the first floor. The two remaining second-floor windows are symmetrically arrayed above the east door and its flanking window. A shed-roofed, one story porch spans the facade. Roof covering is standing-seam metal; a corbeled interior end chimney exits from the peak of the east gable, while a patch in the roof in the corresponding position indicates that a chimney has been removed from the west end.

While the interior of the house was not examined, its form and proportions suggest log construction.


