DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The farm is located at the end of a dirt driveway from the end of Susann Drive, west of Manchester. The complex contains a farmhouse, large barn, and small out-buildings.

The house faces south and is built into a bank. It is two stories high with a high basement on its south side, and has a gable roof with a chimney located to the west of center. A two story ell is located to the rear, with its gable roof ridge perpendicular to that of the main block. The house is sheathed with grey-green asphalt shingles.

The main block is four bays wide by one deep. On the principal facade the second story contains four windows, and the first floor is enclosed by a screened porch with a half-hip roofed porch. This porch is over a basement story which contains a central doorway flanked on each side by one window. The west gable end contains one window in each story.

To the south of the house are a garage and small sheds. To the west of the house is a tall bank barn, whose first story has been partially modernized and which has four louvred ventilators and a central doorway in its second story south wall.

This is probably the J. Schaeffer property shown on the 1862 Martenet atlas of Carroll County, and that of Jac. Shaffer on the 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson atlas of the county.
