DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located on the north side of Shiloh Road, west of Hampstead, set back at a distance from the road and approached by a long dirt driveway. The complex contains the present main farmhouse, large barn, outbuildings, and an earlier house.

The present farmhouse is built into a bank and faces south, and is 2 1/2 stories high on a full basement on the south side. It is gable roofed, with a central cross gable on the south, has two brick interior end chimneys, and is of brick construction. The principal (south) facade has a pointed window in the cross gable, three slightly segmentally arched windows in its second story, and on the first floor, there is a central doorway flanked by a window on each side.

A one-story porch extends along the first floor of this facade, and wraps around the east end of the building. It features decorative white wooden brackets and balustrade. The basement south wall has a central doorway and a window in its east end.

To the east of the house is the earlier house, which is two stories high, gable roofed, and of longer and lower proportions than the present main house. It has a one-story shed roof porch on its south facade. Adjacent to this house is a large bank barn, which has been partially modernized on its basement story. Newer farm buildings are located to the west of the present farmhouse.

This property is probably that of H. or M. Stansbury shown on the 1862 Martenet atlas of Carroll County.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This property is significant as a complex which illustrates a process of growth over generations, principally in its two farmhouses of different periods. Both houses are also of individual interest as examples of two different Carroll County building types of their respective periods; the later house is almost identical to others seen in the area. The low horizontal lines of the earlier house contrast sharply with the vertical emphasis of the later house.


