### **Summary paragraph:**

The house is a two story, four bay by two bay, bank sited Pennsylvania Four-over-Four. The complex contains a house, barn, carriage house, shed and kennel that form a Linear Mid-Atlantic layout.

### **Description**

#### *House ( 1840-1870)*

The farmhouse is a 2-1/2 story, four bay by two bay brick structure covered in modern cedar shingle siding. The metal gable roof is parallel to the road and has an interior brick chimney on the east gable end with a cinder block exterior chimney alongside. Fenestration is regular with two-over-two wood, double-hung windows on all elevations. A wraparound porch extends across the principal [south] facade and along the west elevation. The tapered, wood posts are supported on block piers. The basement level has been enclosed and lattice panels installed under the porch floor.

A 2-1/2 story, two bay by one bay ell addition extends from the north elevation. The metal gable roof is perpendicular to the main block and has an exterior brick chimney in the north gable end. A one story shed addition has been constructed on its east elevation and serves as a mud room/entry area.

#### *Barn (1840-1870)*

The large 2-1/2 story, frame barn is built into a slight bank. Erected on a fieldstone foundation the barn has an unsupported forebay oriented to the south with three wood doors on its south elevation. Arched, wood ventilator windows appear on all elevations and wood, six-over-six windows with arched surrounds are located on the upper level of the gable ends. The metal gable roof is parallel to the road and has two lightening rods on the gable ends. Small, wood 4 lite windows are found on the foundation level of three elevations. On the north elevation [ east block] two, wood two-over-two windows are topped by small arched, wood ventilators.

#### *Outbuildings (1840-1870)*

To the west of the barn is a combination frame carriage house/corn crib with a cedar shingle gable roof which was in the process of being repaired in June, 1996. The carriage house has a shed addition on its north elevation. Behind the carriage house is a frame building with metal gable roof used as a garage. A frame dog kennel is located south of the barn's foldyard.

## 8. Significance

### Summary paragraph:

Sunnyside Farm is representative of a nineteenth century stock farm. The house is a Pennsylvania Four-over-Four with central hall. It is a rural vernacular style with Victorian influences. Within many rural communities, styles such as Georgian, Federal and Greek Revival were commingled with a rural vernacular style to create a subtle or simpler version of the "high" style of architecture. Plans and designs were found in various publications such as the 1804 Domestic Encyclopedia and as residents prospered economically or saw their families increase, they not only enlarged their existing structures but also updated them periodically in the current styles obtained from the plan books.

### History:

Located at the end of Grove's Mill Road, north of Manchester Road and west of Maryland Route 30 and Manchester, Sunnyside Farm is one of the few extant nineteenth century farm complexes still in use as a farm with all outbuildings intact.

### Evaluation:

Constructed circa 1840-1870 Sunnyside Farm is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property is not eligible under Criterion A; no significant events historically or agriculturally have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion B; no persons significant in local, state or national history have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is eligible under Criterion C; the house, barn and outbuildings have been slightly modernized yet retain their original form and function. The complex is one of the few surviving examples of a nineteenth gentleman's farm in the project area.







### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is set back at a long distance from the north side of Maryland Route 27, approached by a long dirt driveway. It is located in an undisturbed agricultural setting, and contains a house, large barn, and several sheds.

The farmhouse is gable-roofed, 2 1/2 stories high on a high basement, facing south and is sheathed with white siding. It consists of a south block and a rear ell, whose roof ridge is perpendicular to that of the south block. There are end chimneys on the east end of the south block and on the north end of the rear ell. A one-story porch with tapered piers on blocks extends along both the south and west facades of the house on the first floor, above the basement.

The principal (south) facade has three windows in its second story, and a stairway leading to the front porch doorway. The west gable end has two windows in both its second and attic stories, with small, square attic windows. The rear ell is one bay deep, with a window in its second story west wall.

To the west of the house, along the driveway leading to the house, are a group of sheds and a large barn. The barn is built on a stone foundation, and has an unsupported forebay on its south facade. It has louvred ventilators, and the attic story window of its west gable is set in an ornamented frame.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This farm is significant as a nineteenth century Carroll County farm complex which still retains its farmhouse, outbuildings and barn in an undisturbed agricultural setting. The barn in particular is a very good example of county barn building, with its unsupported forebay, stone foundation, louvred ventilators and ornamented gable end window, and is intact and in good condition.


