DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ecke/Musselman Farm is located at the end of a very long and winding dirt road, in an undisturbed setting of fields and woods. It contains a house, barn, and outbuildings.

The house faces north and is of brick construction. Its main block is two stories high, gable roofed, and three bays wide, with a one story porch extending along its principal (north) facade. An ell is located to the rear, with a roof ridge perpendicular to that of the main block.

To the north is a large white barn, with its gable end facing the house. This is probably the J. Ecke property shown on Martenet's 1862 atlas of Carroll County, and that of W. Musselman on the 1877 county atlas.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Ecke/Musselman Farm is significant for its fine early to mid nineteenth century house, a good example of a typical house form of the period, which is more often seen in towns in the area than in a rural setting such as this one. Its barn is a good example of Carroll County barn building, and the complex is located in a pastoral and undisturbed rural landscape.
