Summary paragraph:

The house is a two-and-a-half story, bank sited log structure, two bays by two bays. The complex contains the house, a barn and a small frame shed.

Description

House (1790-1800/1820-1850)

The main block is a 2-1/2 story, two bay by two bay, log structure sheathed in vinyl siding. The metal gable roof is perpendicular to the road and has an interior chimney on the north gable end. A one story shed is attached to the west elevation. An open wood porch with enclosed ell traverses the principal [south] facade and wraparound to the east elevation. Fenestration is one-over-one windows on all elevations.

A 2-1/2 story two bay by two bay ell is located on the north elevation and is sheathed in vinyl siding. The metal roof is a flattened gable also perpendicular to the road. One-over-one windows are appear on all elevations. The addition is built into a steep slope.

Barn (1800-1820)

The 2-1/2 story frame barn with fieldstone foundation is located to the south of the main house. It has an unsupported forebay oriented to the east, a metal gable roof perpendicular to the road. Arched, wood ventilators are located on the upper level on the gable ends.

Outbuildings (1930-1950)

A small, frame shed with metal shed roof is located to the northeast of the barn's foldyard. It is used for equipment storage.

8. Significance

Summary paragraph:

The Stoffel Farm is an example of a late eighteenth /early nineteenth century two-over-two plan log house with a rural Federal style addition. Within many rural communities, styles such as Georgian, Federal and Greek Revival were commingled with a rural vernacular style to create a subtle or simpler version of the "high" style of architecture. Plans and designs were found in various publications such as the 1821 Domestic Encyclopedia and as residents prospered economically or saw their families increase, they not only enlarged

their existing structures but also updated them periodically in the current styles obtained from the plan books.

History:

Located on a farm lane north of Water Tank Road, east of Maryland Route 30 and Manchester, the Stoffel Farm is part of the eighteenth century valley settlement located east of Manchester. The farm is listed in the 1862 Martenet Atlas [owner - Sebastian Stoffel] and the 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson Atlas [owner - S. Stoffel].

Evaluation:

Constructed circa 1790-1800 with a circa 1820-1850 addition, the Stoffel Farm is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property is not eligible under Criterion A; no significant events historically or agriculturally have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion B; no persons significant in local, state or national history have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion C; the house is an example of a late eighteenth/early nineteenth century log structure, however, there are more intact and significant examples within the project area.





DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Stoffel/Huber Farm is located in a valley northeast of Manchester, and is reached by a long and steep dirt road from the north side of Watertank Road. It is located just to the north of CARR - 643, the Charles Glass Farm, and is part of a small settlement of small farmsteads in the valley. It contains a house and barn.

The house faces east, and is oriented perpendicular to the Glass house. It is 2 1/2 stories high, built into a bank, and has a high basement on the east side. It is gable roofed, two bays deep by two wide, and has a one story shed roof porch. Of log construction, the house is now sheathed with white siding. To the southwest of the house is a red barn.

This is probably the property of Sebastian Stoffel shown on the 1862 Martenet Atlas of Carroll County, and of S. Stoffel on the 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson atlas of the county.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Stoffel farm is significant as a small 19th century farmstead which contains a log bank house in the Germanic tradition of Carroll County as well as a fine barn. Like the other small farms in this valley, it is important for its setting and as part of the farming community located in this undisturbed valley.




