



<p>In a hidden corner of Northeast is an early gambrel roof dwelling which has several unusual features in its construction. It is three bays long and two bays deep. The center door led to a central hall with walnut stair rail. To the west of the hall was the living room, whose panelling has been installed in Winterthur Museum as the "Cecil Bedroom", and a narrow open porch, the same length as the living room as under the same roof. The hall has been taken away to make the dining room larger. The back of the living room fireplace is exposed on the exterior and the brick is laid in Flemish bond with glazed headers. There are three flat headed dormers on each side of the gambrel roof and all windows have 6/6 sash. The house is built on a stone foundation and was originally covered with beaded shiplap, now with clapboard. Between the studs was brick nogging.</p> <p>Adjoining the house is another early structure of 18th century date (see CE 101A).</p> <p>On the same property were an early mill and cooper shop. The mill race is still in tact and carries water as it did when the mill was in operation.</p>
