The Board of Cecil County Commissioners ordered the Scotchman's Creek Bridge closed in March of 1931. Soon after the Luton Bridge Company submitted a competitive bid to replace the older bridge with a reinforced concrete span. For Cecil County, the Scotchman's Creek Bridge is an unusual and distinctive form. Visually, the six open spandrel arches provide a light structural quality not often associated with the county's reinforced concrete bridges. This aspect is especially evident when comparing the Scotchman's Creek Bridge with its more typical and heavier neighbor, the Bohemia River Bridge.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Scotchman's Creek Bridge spans the mouth of Scotchman's Creek which empties into the Bohemia River at Hacks Point. Maryland Route 213 passes just east of the bridge and connects the two southern Cecil County towns of Chesapeake City and Cecilton.

The single lane arched re-inforced concrete roadbed is supported by six double rib open spandrel arches. The arches, in turn, rest on concrete piers that remain partially above the water level. The roadbed is approximately fifteen to twenty feet and 75 to 100 yards long. A reinforced concrete railing is attached to each side of the bridge. A fixed to the northeast corner post is a Luten Bridge Company date plack with an imposed inscription including the county commissioners. Walter E. Buck, John M. Duncan, and Walter C. Miller along with a 1931 date. The concrete railings received a rough pebble finish while the supportive arches and substructure in general are treated with a smooth finish. The corners of the supportive posts and arches are chamfered.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

For Cecil County, the Scotchman's Creek Bridge is an unusual and distinctive reinforced concrete bridge type. Visually, the six open spandrel arches provide a light structural quality not often associated with the county's reinforced concrete bridges. This aspect is especially evident when comparing the Scotchman's Creek Bridge with its more typical and heavier neighbor, the Bohemia River Bridge.

In comparison to other Luten Bridges in the state, the Scotchman's Creek Bridge is not extremely early or a particularly rare form. Therefore the bridge is mainly significant for Cecil County bridges. Efforts should be made to repair the bridge if possible. Otherwise extensive documentation should be required before the bridge is replaced.




## LOCATION MAP

OF SCOTCHMAN'S CREEK.


LOCATION MAP REPRODUCED FROM
