C. 1830-1840

This farm borders (CE-1041, Clayton-Ellison-Plumb) the previous farm and also has a history of out of County ownership. Richard H. Bayard of Philadelphia owned the house and farm in the late 1860's when he devised the farm to his grandson Christian Bayard Bors by will in April of 1868 (will book 11/361).

The house is one of a few heavy timber frame structures from the second quarter of the 19th century with exposed corner posts.

Its occurrence is not extremely unusual or unexpected since ~~the~~ <sup>the technique</sup>

*has had long use in this primarily English by this time, tradition has English precedents.* The practice at least in Cecil County was being fully replaced by unexposed framing members and later balloon framing.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Bayard ~~timber~~ frame house c. 1830-1840 is a 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> story four bay by one room center hall house that faces east with the main gable on a north/south axis.

The entire house rests on a full fieldstone foundation and is totally sheathed with asbestos shingles over weatherboard siding. The steeply pitched composition tile roof has a plain boxed cornice at its base. Timber frame construction is especially evident in the southwest and northeast corner where the corner posts have not been covered. There is a heavy bead on each post.

The east (main) facade is primarily plain with 6/6 sash windows with beaded corner surrounds. The entrance occupies the second bay from the north of the main <sup>block</sup> ~~house~~. It has been replaced with a modern door. A shed porch with chamfered posts covers the first floor. Shutter lintels do remain on the window surrounds without their shutters.

The south end is basically plain except for a new 6/6 sash on the first floor and two four pane attic lights that flank the brick chimney. The eaves are not extended but closed with a plain bargeboard.

The west side is basically the same as the front with four 6/6 sash on the first floor and three on the second. A 6/6 gabled dormer lights the attic.

The north end of the main block, besides having its own end stack and attic lights, has a 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> story shed kitchen addition. The exterior detailing remains in line with the rest of the house. The first floor interior of the kitchen has been remodeled but the second floor has survived untouched. Access is gained by a winder stair in the southwest corner of the kitchen and leads to two rooms on the second floor which are separated by a raised six panel door with later 19th century stamped iron door latch and handle.

The south parlor <sup>of the main block</sup> has its second quarter of the 19th century mantle with thumb and astragal moldings around the opening. A plain frieze supports <sup>a</sup> molded shelf. West of the fireplace is a six panel closet door and six panel door to second floor stair. A simply molded chair rail extends around most of the room along with a heavily beaded baseboard.

It appears as if one middle wall has been removed to make the first floor a hall/parlor arrangement. The present hall has a very plain mid 19th century mantel with an adjacent winder stair to the second floor. Detailing remains basically the same on the second floor and the attic is finished.

The basement has flat arch chimney supports and pit sawn floor joists.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Bayard Timber frame house is rather unusual since it is such a late use of a heavy timber frame with exposed corner posts. By this time most frame houses have completely covered structural frames. Brief research has taken this property back to the Bayard Family ownership. It is ownly through surviving woodwork that a possible construction date of 1830-1840 could be given.


