Reuben Lake owned this property for a majority of the 19th century and it has remained in the Lake family to this day. Old family photographs document little change to this 2½ story 3 bay by 1 room hall/parlor frame house. The structure is built into a south slope ^{of a hill} so the basement is exposed on the rear elevation which has a two story porch. Unlike the house the nearby mill community of Back Creek has just about disappeared aside from the mill pond and remnants of the race. A two and a half story frame grist mill and a half dozen dwellings ~~that~~ ^{and} appear in old photographs and on maps help to reconstruct the Back Creek Community.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Reuben Lake House c. 1840 is a 2½ story three bay by one room hall/parlor frame house on Old Telegraph Road southeast of Chesapeake City, Md. The house faces north with an east/west gable axis.

The house is built into a south slope so a full three stories is exposed on the south side for access into the first floor kitchen. The fieldstone foundation is only partially excavated. The entire house is covered with asbestos shingle and the steep roof has a composition tile sheathing.

The main elevation has a central entrance and a 6/6 sash on each side. The surrounds have an ovolo molded backband and beaded corner. The central door is a replacement. Three 6/6 sash light the second floor and a simple boxed cornice stretches above. Two 6/6 sash gabled dormers pierce the north slope of the roof. A molded pediment is supported by a fluted surround with a tri-foik cut out in the corner block. A hipped roof porch covers the entire first floor and is supported by chamfered posts with simple capitals.

The east end once had an interior stove stack ^{but} that has been removed. There is a 2/2 sash window on each floor and a two pane attic light along with a six pane basement light. The bargeboard is beaded.

The west end is basically similar with the exception of a much larger brick chimney and a southern placement of the first and second floor sash. The bargeboard is again beaded. A small six pane light illuminates the stair well in the northwestern corner.

The southern side is totally covered by a two story shed roof porch that at least dates to the late 19th century (old photo). The second floor porch was later closed in. There is a central door on each floor with adjacent modified or 6/6 sash windows. The third floor of the porch was closed-in during the 1920's. Two gabled dormers that are identical to the front ones pierce the south slope of the roof.

The basement was the only interior room fully seen. A large cooking fireplace is on the west wall with a simple mantel shelf. Built-in cupboards are found in the southern niche and a winder stair in the northern corner.

The interiors of the first and second floors were not fully seen but mid 19th century woodwork was evident.

The farm property is complete with two medium sized frame barns, a chicken house, wagon sheds; all with field-stone foundations and board and batten siding.
