DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lincoln-Bradley House c. 1830-1860 is a two story five bay by one room common bond brick and frame house with a pinkish color brick veneer on Maryland 273 just west of Rising Sun. The house faces north with an east/west gable orientation.

The house rests on a full fieldstone foundation and is covered by a medium sloped slate roof.

The north elevation consists of five bays, the western three constituting the first house. The three bays are symmetrically arranged around a central entrance. The four panel front door has a three light transom. The adjacent 6/6 sash windows are directly aligned with the second floor windows. A corbelled brick cornice is covered by the brick veneer. Interior end brick stove stacks rise out of each end wall of the brick house along with the attached frame sections gable end. The frame addition has a door and window on the first floor and two 6/6 sash on the second floor. The central three bays are covered by a hip roof porch with champered posts and stick brackets. A stick balustrade stretches between each post.

The east and west gable ends have two 6/6 sash on each floor and two 2/2 attic sash windows. The eaves are not extended and a plain bargeboard covers the end gables.

The south facade has an identical arrangement of doors and windows an a shed roof porch covers the entire first floor. The common bond brick and frame walls are partially exposed under the porch roof. A basement entrance under the porch allows access through to the basement under the frame section. The interior of this house was not seen at time of survey. The western portion however was judged to have a central stair with room to each side.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This two story three bay by one room central stair form is a common house type for the entire County. Its associated frame gable end addition is a natural enlargement and probably expanded kitchen facilities. The front porch was obviously added later to unify the new five bay facade. J. H. Lincoln appears on the 1877 as owned this property along with more major land holdings across the road. This structure was probably used as a tenant house.


