**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Boyd-Johnson House c. 1877 is a two story three bay by one room weatherboard frame house on New Valley Road just south of McCaulley Road. The house faces east with the main gable running north/south.

The main block rests on a fieldstone foundation and is sheathed with novelty siding. The medium sloped standing seam tin roof has extended eaves and sloped soffits. Later shed additions extend to the south and west.

The main elevation consists of a central entrance. The door has been replaced as have the first floor windows. The earlier 6/6 sash opening has been reduced to a double single pane sash windows. The second floor retains its three 6/6 sash windows. The first floor is fully covered by a shed roof porch with chamfered posts simple "C" curve corner brackets.

The gable ends are primarily plain with the addition of exterior block stove stacks. A single 6/6 sash does light the first floor of the south end under the 20th century enclosed shed addition.

The interior has been moderately remodeled. An enclosed central stair is flanked by a room on either side. A few four panel doors remain along with some ogee molded baseboards.
