DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The White-Settle House c. 1860 is a 2½ story three bay by one room center hall frame house with two story ell kitchen to the rear. The house faces east and Colora Road with the main gable running north/south.

The house rests on a full fieldstone foundation and is totally covered with horizontal novelty siding. The steeply pitched roof is covered with a galvanized tin shingle.

The east (main) elevation has a central entrance with flanking 2/4 first floor sash windows with plain surrounds. The entrance has four heavily molded panels which are framed by a single light transom and two light sidelights with a panel below. The second floor has a double central window with two 2/2 sash that are protected by a bracketed hood.

The roof slope has a central cross gable with 2/2 gable window and a decorative pierced fascia which terminates at the bottom with a drop pendant. An identical pendant hangs from the peak of the fascia. A gabled 2/2 sash dormer is found either side of the central gable. Two central brick chimney stacks rise out of the center of the house and flank the center hall. The first floor is covered by a three bay porch with a standing seam tin roof. The front support posts have been ~~replaced~~ ^{replaced} ~~by~~ ^{but} the wall posts remain with there corner brackets.

The north end has a single 2/2 sash on each floor and a 2/2 arched sash to light the attic. The eaves are extended.

The south end is similar with the addition of a five sided bay window ^{WITH} three 2/2 sash windows.

The rear ell addition is not flush with the south wall. The wing is two bays across by one room deep with a central side entrance. The first floor is covered with a shed roof porch with chamfered posts. The porch has a rusticated block foundation. Newer and larger windows have been cut through on either side of the entrance but 6/6 sash remain on the second floor. The gable end has a recently added exterior brick chimney. A two story shed extension is attached to the north side of the kitchen wing.

The interior was not fully seen but it was evident that a heavily turned newel post supported a flat oval handrail that rose continuously to the third floor. Turned balusters also support the handrail.

The associated farm buildings are located a good distance ^(approx.) (100 yards) from the main house and set on a pependicular axis to the main house. The frame barn is set into the south slope of the hill.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This typical 2½ story three bay by one room center hall form is detailed with a few unusual characteristics. The use of the imitation tin shingle is an uncommon survivor. The addition of the ~~house~~ ^{first} decorative elements such as the bay window, hood over the second window ~~are~~ ^{and} pierced fascia raise this structure above the more plain examples.
