DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Beaven-~~Shore~~^{WATERMAN} House began as a single story 24'3" x 21'3" log house of undetermined date. (~~Now~~ probably early 19th century) The original log house was extended to the east by stone (3/4 structural walls) with a common interior log wall. The house probably remained a single story until the mid 19th century when a 1 1/2 story frame raised the main block and a 1/2 story frame ~~was added to~~^{RAISED} the stone wing. Evidence for the mid 19th century frame raising is found on the second floor with a reduction in the thickness of the walls and all mid 19th century woodwork. The corner stair was probably added at the same time also. The house rests on a full fieldstone foundation and is covered with asbestos shingle over weatherboard. A steeply pitched composition shingle roof covers the structure.

The house is located south of Rowland Road and just east of Rock Run. The main facade has a southern exposure with the primary gable running east/west.

The south facade of the log section is two bays across with an entrance in the eastern bay. The door has been replaced. 6/6 sash windows occupy the other openings. A corner bead on the surround serves as decorative window trim. Two identical sash light the second floor. A hip roofed porch covers the first floor and is supported by partially chamfered posts. A boxed cornice stretches across at the base of the roof and two gabled 6/6 sash dormers light the attic. The south side of the stone wing is two bays across with an entrance in the western of the two openings. A three sided bay window occupies the other bay and the shed roof porch covers the first floor of the wing. The south roof slope of the 1 1/2 story wing has a single 6/6 sash dormer.

The east end is a stone wall that has been covered with stucco. A central window lights the room along with the second floor.

The west gable end of the log house has an exposed basement kitchen and two 6/6 sash on each floor and two 4/4 attic sash that flank the interior end brick chimney. ~~The east wall of the porch house.~~

A two story frame shed addition stretches across the back of the log house and is supported by a fieldstone foundation which appears ^{to be a} continuation from the main foundation.

The interior of the basement kitchen is fully whitewashed and an operating fireplace is on the west wall. A spring runs through the basement. A ~~plain~~ flat timber lintel arch supports the other stack. 19th century cut nails are found in the basement. The area under the stone section is partially excavated and a stair leads to the first floor.

The main floor of the log section is one large room with the east wall fireplace. ~~The~~ flat arch is supported by a granite lintel. What seems to be a later stair with mid to late 19th century trim and a stair balustrade was probably added when the house was raised. As mentioned before the second floor has all mid to late 19th century trim and thinner walls.

A two story timber frame ^{and stone} barn stands to the south and west of the house and rests on a fieldstone foundation. It is set into a bank with a projecting entrance bay on the east side. The stone is nicely shaped and laid in courses. A later shed addition to house a dairy is attached to the south side and a shed addition off the back end.

A small frame granary with side storage bins stands north of the barn.
