DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Taylor-Galary House c. 1850 is a two story three bay by one room center hall frame house with an ell kitchen. A supposed log house is attached to the gable end of the kitchen. The house faces Principio Road just north of Perryville, Md. The house faces west with a north/south gable orientation.

The house rests on a fieldstone foundation and is completely covered with asbestos shingle over weatherboard. A composition tile hipped roof covers the main block with extended eaves and sloped soffits. Plain gable roofs cover both the main kitchen and rear addition.

The main elevation has a central entrance with heavily molded and arched panels. The door is framed by a five light transom and five light sidelights with a panel below. Single 6/6 sash windows flank the entrance and have louvered shutters. Three identical sash light the second floor. A seamed tin hipped roof porch covers the first floor and is supported by squar tuscan columns which was added in the early 20th century (Colonial Revival).

The south gable end has had a larger picture window added on the first floor and two 6/6 sash light the second floor.

The north end has two 6/6 sash on each floor. The rear ell kitchen is flush with the north wall and is two bays across by one room deep. The supposed log section is also two bays across by one room and only a 1½ high. The walls are thicker than the main block.

The south side of the kitchen wing has a two story porch and the second floor is fully enclosed while the first floor has been left open. The side door has an adjacent 6/6 sash. The log section has a small stoop with adjacent 6/6 sash window. The gable end of the log section has an attached exterior fieldstone chimney with flanking six pane attic windows.

The interiors have been moderately remodeled. The interior hall wall was removed to make a larger room and a new stair balustrade was put in. Four panel doors are framed by plain door and window surrounds with plain corner blocks. The log house interior has been fully paneled. A tight winder has remained in the southeast corner but has been partially rebuilt.

The only 19th century building is the 1½ story box frame b with earthen ramp on the north side. A fieldstone foundation supports the frame.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The owner possesses a mid 19th century hand drawn plat of the property and dated 1866. The surveyor was Ellis G. Chandlee. He mentions George Taylor's Property as being between E. Gosgrove's Mill to the north and Moutton's Smith Shop at the spot where Patterson's Parking lot is today. The house is a common three bay center hall form that is altered by a hipped roof and sturdy Colonial Revival front porch.
