This house may be the house occupied by Mrs. Heckart as shown on the 1877 Atlas of Cecil County. Its proximity to Heckart House II (CE-1276) suggests that one of the two buildings was a tenant house for the other. The later date of this house may indicate that this was the tenant house. The Heckart House I has a stone foundation supporting a two-story frame structure with a two-level porch on the west elevation.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Quarters G or the Heckart House I is a two-story frame house on a stone foundation located on the east slope of a ravine between Tome and Benson Roads on the grounds of the Susquehanna-Chesapeake Job Corps Center (formerly Bainbridge Naval Training Center) near Port Deposit, Maryland.

The house has a two-story porch on the west elevation with a scroll-sawn balustrade and turned columns. The east or main elevation has a two-story porch, the upper level of which is screened. The gable roof is covered in modern composition material and a brick chimney projects from the center of the roof. The present exterior covering is aluminum siding. The fenestration is six over six sliding sash with modern aluminum storm windows.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Quarters G may have been built about 1842 and was probably owned by Mrs. Heckart in the 1870's, as shown on the 1877 Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson Atlas of Cecil County. Its proximity to Quarters H (Heckart House II - CE-1276), immediately east of the house, suggests that one of the two buildings was a tenant house for the other. The later date of Quarters G leads to a tentative conclusion that it was the tenant house.

Both houses were renovated for officers' quarters by the Navy and are currently occupied by Job Corps Center employees.


Heckart Houses I & II


