
Port Deposit Granite. Small wood-framed four-light windows are found around the washhouse and it is in fair condition and contributes to the historical significance of the tavern.

The house has had several uses over the years, including a residence, grocery store, and its namesake- a tavern. Each use has inflicted strain on the building, however, it remains in good to fair condition. The masonry was heavily and poorly repointed with hard, Portland Cement. The window glazing is not original and the porches were removed (which may or may not have been original to the structure). The area around the house is somewhat cluttered with various materials. However, the building remains a clear and solid example of a colonial folk house with the telling symmetrical façade and imposing chimney stacks flanking the gabled roofline. Also, the kitchen ell and separate wash house tell a story on how people lived during these times and how a colonial house functioned. The local materials and quality workmanship implemented in the construction have maintained the house as it is today in its original location and rural setting. The feeling of colonial times is somewhat compromised by the cluttered property and additions, yet the design reflects a clear example of a typical style of this time and therefore should be nominated to the National Register of Historic Properties under Criterion C.

There is a center door on both floors of the southeast facade. Above the windows are stone lintels of st single rectangular stones. Sash on the southeast facade is 9/1 on the first floor and 6/1 on the second floor. The two dormers have 6/6 sash. Across the entire front of the building is a modern concrete block porch.
