On route 213 on the south edge of Cecilton stands a very small one story log house with steeply pitched roof. It is constructed in the Swedish manner and has vertical boards and battens over the exterior and patches of asbestos shingle. There is a door and window on the facade. Inside there is a small room which has a fireplace and exposed beam ceiling and board floor. To the right of the fireplace is a door leading to a small room which has a window and a door. To the left of the fireplace is a small door in the board partition which houses ladder to the loft.
