Taylor's Store was in operation for nearly one hundred years before it closed in 1950. It is built of frame and is three bays wide with double doors which have bars over the upper panel of glass. The windows under the front porch have paneled shutters and batten shutters close the side windows. There is a single window above the door in the stepped false front. There is a hipped leanto shed in the rear of the building.

5. PHYSICAL CONDITION OF STRUCTURE Endangered yes Interior Exterior poor

This store has been razed and rebuilt at Battle Swamp (Woodlawn) on Jacob Tom's memorial Highway. The porch posts were originally oars on rafts which came down the Susquehanna River in olden times.
