Based on information provided by SHA, Bridge 7007 does not meet the National Register Criteria for individual listing. The two part, concrete arch and concrete beam bridge constructed circa 1920 has no known engineering or historical significance. In addition it is severely deteriorated. The bridge is located the Principio Furnace Historic District (CE-112) and (18CE48), which is significant for its association with iron production in Maryland from the early 18th through the late 19th centuries. Abundant archeological features and standing structures survive to document the development of the industry and the lives of the workers. However, the bridge falls outside the period of significance for the district and has no real association with the district.


