Section 7.1

The Cann Stone House Ruins are located in Cecil County within the Fair Hill N.R.M.A., just to the south of the Mason-Dixon Line, and off of a dirt access road (near the Horse Training Center) that runs through the Resource Area boundaries. It is situated on a slight rise of a hill with the front facade of the structure facing to the north.

The house is two-stories tall, has an overall "I"-shaped design, and was constructed entirely of uncut fieldstone. This fieldstone also has all irregular courses and was at one point entirely covered with plaster on the exterior. The structure was built in two distinct sections and judging from past photographs both the sections were of about the same dimensions. The roof is side-gabled with a replacement roofing material of composition shingles. All windows and doors are missing, but the wood frames of these for the most part still remain intact.

The condition of the house has deteriorated severely since the loss of the roof. It also appears that it has been hit by a couple of fallen trees which has demolished one whole half of the structure. Much of the interior fabric appears to have been stripped before the house was hit by the trees.

Also on the property are the remains of a structure that has a fieldstone foundation, but the upper structure is gone. It was probably a small barn.


