The house and barn, as described in the 1979 Maryland Inventory Forms for State Historic Sites Survey, do not match the structures that are there now.

This house, located within the Fair Hill Natural Resources Management Area on Kennel Road, is a Cape Cod style that is one and one half stories tall, and five bays long by two bays wide. There are three dormers on the front facade with a larger centered dormer and then a smaller dormer located on each side. The house is covered in asbestos shingles, the roof is covered in asphalt shingles, and the windows are 6/6 sash. The front door is constructed of wood and there are sidelights on each side of the door. A simple front porch with a flat roof and a concrete pad is located on the front facade.


