Located at 1195 Augustine Herman Highway, Elkton, Maryland, the Lindsay House is a two story frame building situated on approximately 2 acres of land. Setback 100 feet from the highway, the dwelling is a modest representative of the Colonial Revival style of architecture, circa 1910. The gabled main block measures five bays wide and is flanked by one story wings. An exterior stone chimney is visible, interrupting the boxed cornice. Alterations include some additions, enclosure of side porch with jalousie windows, synthetic siding. A frame garage for three cars is the only other building on the property. DHMH did not provide any information concerning the history/occupancy that could relate to Criteria A or B. A common property type, the building does not appear to possess distinctive characteristics of type, period or method of construction. Based on this limited information, I believe that the building is not eligible.

DHMH owns the building and leases it to a non-profit organization for a group home.
