Description of Property and Justification: *(Please attach map and photo)*

The dwelling located at 727 Mt. Nebo Road is a one story building with a hipped roof topped with a gable roof that contains a 3-light dormer in the south end. 727 Mt. Nebo Road is clad in German siding and the roof is of asphalt shingles. The rafter tails are exposed on all four sides of the building. The building is two bays wide and has a side entry. Sidelights and original lamps surround the main entrance on the south façade. The entrance is covered by a shed roof that is supported by machine cut scroll brackets. Paired windows fill the second bay of the main façade. In the east façade, there are two single windows, while on the west there are three. Each is a double hung sash window with 6 over 1 lights. The rear porch is attached to the house, covering 3/4 of the main pile on the north side and is enclosed with ten windows which are of the same design as the other windows -- 6 over 1 lights, double hung sashes in the west and north facades. At the northeast corner of the dwelling is a second entrance, leading into the enclosed porch.

A one story shed dating from the original construction stands to the northeast of the house. It is also clad in German siding, has a gable roof in asphalt shingles and one 6 over 1 double hung sash window.

According to the current owner, 727 Mt. Nebo Road was originally constructed as the gatehouse for a large estate located

southeast of the building at the end of Mt. Nebo Road (personal communication with Mr. Edward Boas, December 22, 2005).

According to the Cecil County Tax Records, 727 Mt. Nebo Road has a construction date of 1920. However, the decorative scroll work on the entrance and the exposed rafters indicate that the Queen Anne style cottage dates to the first or second decade of the twentieth century, most likely pre-World War I, circa 1915. Although 727 Mt. Nebo Road stands along MD 286, the causeway constructed by the USACE in 1932 to connect 2nd Street with the USACE facility to the northeast, research did not identify any associations between 727 Mt. Nebo Road and either the C&D Canal or the USACE. The historic boundary is confined to the tax parcel shown on Cecil County Tax Map 200, Parcel 36.

727 Mt. Nebo Road retains excellent integrity of design, materials, workmanship and feeling. Based on the above description, the building is eligible for inclusion in the NRHP under Criterion C (architecture). Research conducted did not identify events or persons of local, state or national significance and the building is not eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A or B. Criterion D was not investigated as part of the historic standing structures studies.


