4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC

Gilpin Manor is a two story brick house which has been covered with stucco to imitate ashlar masonry. It is three bays long and two bays deep and stands upon a chamfered water table above the basement. The most outstanding feature of the building is the heavy modillion cornice which encircles the building, forming a pediment of the east gable. On the west side of the house is a 19th century addition about the same size as the main house and a little taller. The door is a plain paneled door with a transom above and is located on the westernmost bay of the old section which was constructed around 1760. The windows are all later than the original house and have 6/6 sash and paneled and louvered shutters. A 19th century clerestory dormer has been added to the south side of the "A" roof which lights the attic.

Gilpin Manor resembles several of the houses in Elkton, one being the Rollins House, located next to the new Court House.
