4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **NO**

Spring Run Farm House is a large late Federal house covered with stucco. It is five bays long and two bays deep. There is a later porch across the first story south facade. The large double chimneys in each gable are connected by a curtain wall. At the base of the chimneys is a narrow string course. Between the chimneys in the attic is a three-part windows on both gables. The entrance has recessed paneled double doors with transom above and recessed panel jambs.

The farm remained in the Armstrong family from 1730, when it was granted by Lord Baltimore, until 1934 when it was purchased by J.A. Bennett. It has recently been sold.
