4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION  <p>This house was a double house, at one time part of a mill complex which no longer exists. It is built into the side of a hill. The west side is one story and was four bays long with two center doors, one of which has recently been replaced with a window. The east side is two full stories, with the same treatment as the west facade on the first floor and two windows on the second floor. There are huge square stone chimneys in each gable which service two fireplaces inside. A recent wing has been added on the north side of the house. The interior was divided into two rooms on the main floor which has been made into one room, now having a spiral enclosed stair to the attic and basement beside each fireplace. The basement floor had a storage room in each section on the west side of the kitchen.</p> <p>It overlooks a small meadow with stream meandering thru to the Little Elk Creek, nearby.</p>	OPEN TO PUBLIC NO





This small stone house stood by the side of the road near Harlan Mill. It was occupied by Emory Sebala and later by Marion "Annan", who were employed as teamsters at the mill. The house has been greatly enlarged by Mr. Howell. The original house was built about the same time as the mill in 1811. The public road was open to Carter's Mill and Providence.
