<p>This is a small and pleasant brick structure, late colonial in its detail, even though it was built about 1800. It is three bays wide and one room deep and has a rather steeply pitched A-roof. The first story windows are 9/6, while those on the second story are 6/6. The only windows on the eads are two tiny ones at the attic level.. There is a cornice along the front and back roof lines composed of two rows of projecting bricks. There is a water table on the front and back of the house and simple protruding brick. There is an enclosed brick chimney at each end of the house. The chimneys have rather elaborately molded caps. The ends of the house are of common bond brick and contain many random glazed headers. On one end wall there are holes in the bricks where the scaffolding was attached to the house. On the front (water) side of the house are two 6/6 dormers with shaped boards in their pediments. These dormers come from a c. 1800 house in Chestertown. In front of this house is much boxwood which extends down ^{is edge} to the river.
