DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Pyle's store is a two story frame structure with two bays on George Street and six bays on Second Street. Most of the first story fenestration has been altered, but the second story remains original, including the trim and 6/6 sash.

Apparently the red weatherboard building was originally four bays long on Second Street, but two bays were added later in the 19th century.

There are irregular clerestory windows in the store section with a door and window in the later addition..

Since the building is located on the corner it has a semi-hip roof, which is covered with raised seam tin. At the juncture of the two sections is a small chimney.

At one time during the life of the building there was an entrance on the corner of the building but it is now located on Second Street.

The building has other additions on the north side which are not very visible from the streets.

Its appearance could be improved if a more symmetrical first story were achieved, however, the present color contrast is very interesting.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Pyle's Store is not particularly noteworthy from an architectural standpoint. It does, however, provide a good aspect for a corner building in that it faces both streets. Its roof causes this illusion and is unique in town. Its scale is very complimentary to the corner.

Pyle's store stands on a piece of land conveyed to Kendall Cropper by Richard H. Bayard in 1836. Since that time a business of some sort has probably been on this corner. There have been many stores in Chesapeake City over the years but this one on the corner of George Street and Second Street survives partly because of its good location and partly because it provides a large variety of necessities. The corner location has been ideal for commercial property, even when George Street was not the main approach to town.







Sanborn Map 1933, Sheet 4


