DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Jones Farmhouse is a two-story brick building. The interior has been stuccoed and white-washed. It has a basement and a stone foundation. The window sash is 6/6 with much of the original glass remaining. The wood work is very plain. The house is shaped like an (L) upside-down L. The foot of the L is a more recent addition and is of frame construction. There is a central fireplace with back-to-back fireplaces. The walls are about one foot thick. The facade of the building has a one-story porch running its entire length. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles but was originally wooden. There is a brick cornice under the edge of the roof. The floors are random-width pine.

There are several ruins in the woods nearby and a granery which was used up to 1910.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This building other than being a farmhouse could have been part of the property connected to the mill on the creek that flows just to the north of the house. The house is rumored to have been built around 1740 but the floors suggest a date around 1795-1805. They are identical to the floor in the west or McKall House in North East built in 1798.
