DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame building is located in a small hollow 30 yards north of a small stream. It is one-and-one-half stories in height and has two inside end chimneys, north and south. The roof is of gable construction and has asbestos shingles. The building at one time had clapboard siding but the exterior is now covered with shingles similar to those on the roof. The building rests on a full story foundation which is constructed of fieldstone and is white-washed. This serves not only as a cellar but also as a method to escape flooding. The exterior woodwork is plain, the roof has a box cornice and the windows throughout are 2/2 sash. There are two small windows in the gable ends in the upper half story. Two gabled dormers face the street from the half story. Along the front of the building is a Victorian porch which is supported by pillars made of concrete blocks. At the rear of the building is a small enclosed porch.


