DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Set back from the street adjoining the bank and actually on William Street is a plain frame house, two bays long and one bay deep. Its walls are covered with steel grey asbestos siding and the roof with green asphalt roofing.

On the first story east facade is a door beneath a small plain leanto porch and a small 6-pane casement with 3-window bay between. On the second story are two windows with 6/1 sash. A chimney pot can be seen on the rear slope. The gable facing Second Street has irregular fenestration.

Between the house and bank is a handsome large locust tree which enhances the appearance of the building.







Sanborn Map 1933, Sheet 4


