DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Between the Bennett-Reed house and the Onizuk-Coleman house is a three bay wide, two story frame dwelling similar to the Cooling-Coleman house two doors south. The building stands upon a masonry foundation and the walls are covered with very light grey weatherboards. Shutters and trim are painted white and the raised seam tin roof is painted aluminum.

Across the first story is a porch supported on three champ-hered posts with very plain cornice, as though it has been renewed. Between the posts is a balustrade except for the entrance which is located on the north side of the east facade. Its door has been replaced with a modern hollow-core item. On the first story, the windows have 1/1 sash and paneled shutters, the latter appearing to be replacements. On the second story, the windows have 6/6 sash. There is a two story bay window on the north gable which has 6/1 sash in each facet. Behind the structure is a four bay long wing with porch on its south facade. It possesses a brick chimney in the center of the wing which is lacking in the front portion.




