DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The dwelling on the northeast corner of George and Third Streets. is a two bay wide, two bay deep frame dwelling, standing upon a concrete block foundation with a two bay long, two story wing on the rear, and a leanto porch along the south and east sides. Beneath the roof of the east is also an enclosed room, probably the kitchen.

The hip roof porch is supported on square paneled posts with "X" lattice balustrade between. The entrance is located on the north side of the west facade, beside the two windows of the first story. The walls of the building are covered with grey asphalt siding and the windows have been altered to 1/1 sash. The 'A' roof is covered with the same type asbestos roofing as the Post Office.

On the gables is a fretwork barge board similar to the small house on Second Street near the branch and another building on Third at Pine Street.

Raised seam tin is used on the south porch and the balustrade is the same as the front. There is lattic between the piers. The rear wing is smaller than the front and has 2/2 sash. A stuccoed chimney rises within its gable.

Behind the property is a small shed covered with pressed tin siding and corrugated roofing. On the north side is a large well maintained yard.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The building is architecturally unimportant in its own right, however, it does possess the same form and scale as the other buildings on the block.

This house has occupied an important corner in town for many years. From the side porch, the family could watch activity at the church across Third Street and traffic heading north and south through town. The building was probably home for boatmen on the Canal.

Across the alley in back, a busy commercial center existed in the latter half of the nineteenth century and on into the early years of the twentieth century. A wagon shop, a paint shop for carriages and wagons, a barber shop were all located here.






