DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Standing on the east side of the lot is a small frame one story bungalow or cabin similar to small summer cabins built along the Elk River in places like Crystal Beach. It is essentially a rectangular structure with 'A' roof, having a leanto on the north and an enclosed porch leanto on the west. A block chimney rises from the south wall. Its walls are covered with grey asbestos siding and weatherboard and the trim is painted white.

The structure is of 20th century date and bears little importance to the town, however, it is the only such building in the district.

The older residents of Chesapeake City claim that the product turned out by this bottling plant was the best soft drink they ever tasted. The soft drink was sold under the Spa Springs Bottling Company label around the county from 1906 - 1930.

Since the plant went out of business the building has been remodeled and rented as a house.






