DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

On the northwest corner of George and Fourth Streets stands an early two story hip roof frame dwelling, three bays wide and three bays deep with a one bay, two story leanto, and a one bay, one story leanto on its west side. Across its street facade is a one story porch in poor condition, but retaining three of the four original champhered posts and the cornice. A balustrade has been removed. It is painted green and white.

The walls of the house are covered with blue asphalt shingles and the trim is painted white. An entrance with transom and wide trim is located on the northernmost bay. Windows on both storys have 6/6 sash and formerly had shutters. Its hip roof is covered with raised seam tin and the cornice is intact. A brick chimney rises from the center of the roof. A second shimney rises from between the one and two story additions in the center of the building. The rear of the second story leanto the rafters are exposed and shaped.

Behind the building is an early board and batten stable of which few remain in the district. Since its construction, it has been enlarged.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Blevins-Bungard House is similar to the Bennett House on Bohemia Avenue. It is representative of the mid-19th century, vernacular dwelling with the variation of a hip roof. It retains several good details, but has not secured the affections of the present owner to maintain it as it deserves.

The original lease was assigned to Peter Bungard in 1856 by Richard H. Bayard. The Bungard family kept a general store near the Canal. This house has no significance other than being home for the storekeeper Mr. Bungard, and another storekeeper in the twentieth century, Mr. Louitt.






