DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The seventh house south of Second Street is a simple two bay frame, two story dwelling with hip roof porch on the Charles Street facade. There is a two story addition on the east side of the building with a leanto addition on its north side.

The walls of the structure are covered with white weatherboard and the 'A' roof with green asphalt shingle. A brick chimney rises within the north gable. The hip roof porch has the same covering as the main roof and it is supported on turned posts with plain balustrade and pierced brackets. Beneath is a lattice between the piers.

The entrance is located on the south bay and the north bay has 2/2 sash. The second story windows have 1/1 sash.

Between this house and its neighbor to the north is a picket fence.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The A.M.E. parsonage is typical of the small two bay dwellings of Chesapeake City. Its presence here on Charles Street repeats the rythm that the adjoining dwellings create.

This small well kept house is the property of the A.M.E. church. Originally it was the home provided for the minister of the church. In recent years, the house has been rented and provides some regular income for the church. The house like its neighbors, was probably built as a home for workers on the Canal and boats that used the Canal.







 Sanborn Map 1933, Sheet 4


