DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame clapboard house is two sections, each almost square, that overlap as shown below. A-frame roof ridge line runs north-south. Both sections have 2 1/2 stories, with shuttered windows, 6 left over 6, located for interior convenience, not symmetry.

Section A is basically a side-hall house with the hall along the north wall and two parlors to the south. Two broad flat chimneys rest inside the south wall from fireplaces on each of three floors. Eaves are trim, ~~and~~ cornices without decoration.

Section B, smaller, has lower ceilings and wider eaves, smaller windows.

There are three open porches.



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

An individual variation on the widely-used frame clapboard side-hall country house plan, "the Hideaway" ~~was built~~ original house was burned in 1812, and rebuilt soon thereafter (by 1820) on the same foundations.

The site ~~is~~ is (valuable) waterfront on the Sassafras River surrounded by boat yards and moorings. The shaded grassy lawn is in ~~sharp~~ contrast.

On the river edge at Fredricktown stands a two story clapboard house with "A" roof. It is three bays wide and two rooms deep. It is built on a brick foundation and has two tall chimneys of brick on the south side. The main door of the facade is to the north. It has six raised panels and transoms above. The 6/6 sash have paneled snuffers ~~and~~ on the first floor and louvered shutters on the second and attic floors. There are 6/6 windows on each gable in the attic. On the northwest corner of the house is a later addition approximately two thirds the size of the original house and equally as tall. Each of the doors open onto a one story porch.

On the property is a small weathere~~d~~ outbuilding which appears to double as a necessary house and tool shed.




