DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The second house south of Second Street on the east side of Charles Street is a blue grey frame building, two bays wide and two storys tall. Across its facade is a leanto porch supported on three turned posts but there are no brackets or balustrade. The first story has two windows with 1/1 sash and white trim with a central door between. On the second story are two windows with 2/2 sash.

On the south side of the 'A' roof is a brick chimney. Behind the main part of the building is a two story addition, two bays long.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Like each of the buildings on Charles Street the Nowland-Kirk House maintains the uniformity of rythm and scale along the street. Its form is almost identical to its neighbors.

The original lease for this simple house was (HHM 3/296) in the name of William Kirk and the lease mentions a house. Since the property was leased from the Bayard family, it has had only two owners. This has always been a single family dwelling, for working people.






