DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

On the southeast corner lot of Charles and Second Streets is a small two story frame structure two bays wide and one deep with a one story leanto addition on the east side. The walls and roof are covered with grey/green asphalt shingle and the trim is painted white. On the south gable is a small black chimney. A scalloped barge board distinguishes the north gable which faces Second Street.

Around the lot is a privet hedge.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Brooks-Banks House is of interest to Charles Street as it is the focal point for the rythm along Charles Street. Its scol-
 loped barge board offers a small contrast to the other similar build-
 ings.

This tiny house commands an unrestricted view of the C. & D.
 Canal. When H. Burgett operated the steam sawmill at the west end
 of Second Street in the 1870 - 1890 period, this corner was a busy
 one. Much of the finished lumber as well as the logs to be sawed
 were transported on the Canal but there was necessarily a lot of
 traffic to and from the mill, one of the biggest employers in
 Chesapeake City.






