DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The McInturff House is a two-story brick farmhouse, three-bays by two. To the rear of the front section are two additional sections. The one directly behind the brick was probably the original home; it had a cooking fireplace. It is frame and one-and-a-half stories in height. The brick section has a full cellar with stone walls. The floor joists are sawn. The stairway from the cellar to the first floor has hand-split lath visible. In the north gable end is a fireplace with an inside end chimney. The front door is located in the central bay. There are several board and batten doors which seem to be original to the house as is the mantel. Some of the window sash is also original and has six panes over six. The roof is now asphalt, but owner's grandfather put a wooden shingle roof on.

The brickwork is covered by white tile shingles which were put on in the 1930's. The owner thinks that the bricks were laid in common bond. Across the front of the house is a one-story three-bay Victorian porch. Under the roof is a brick cornice.
