The Groye Neck School was a one-story frame schollhouse. It had a small brick chimney in the gable end and had a clapboard exterior. The window sash was six lights over six and the windows had louvered shutters. The roof had wooden shingles. It was approximately three bays long and one wide.

This structure was torn down in 1941 by Mrs. A. Pierce.
