**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Leroy England House is half log and half frame two stories in height. The logs are laid in saddle notch style while the frame section had very wide clapboard. Originally there were two inside end chimneys but not there is only one in the east gable end. A central staircase has replaced two winding ones which were built next to the chimneys. The mantels are Victorian. The house has a stone foundation with cellar.

The house is five bays by two bays, but originally was two by two. The exterior is now covered with tile shingles. One door has a box lock with spoon handle. Across the facade is a one story porch which dates from the mid 1800's. The sash is 2/2.

In addition to the house, is a frame barn and several small outbuildings. One of these was a cobblers shop.
