**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Wallace House is of Gothic Revival. It is a two story frame structure four bays long by three bays wide. The house had clapboard but now aluminum siding. The eastern three bays have a one story porch on the facade and a pedimented gable in the roof. In the western most bay there is a two story bay window with barge board and finial in the pedimented roof. The roof of the house has different patterns of slate shingles. There are two interior chimneys made of brick. The house has a hallway which also contains an open string staircase with turned oak balusters. A two storey frame addition was built on the rear of the building and probably served as a kitchen. The windows all have modern sash. The house has a stone foundation and cellars.
