DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Du Pont Tenant Farmhouse is a two-and-a-half story brick dwelling three bays by two with a two-story two-by-two bay rear wing. The facade has double entrance each with a three-light transom. There is a one-story front porch with chamfered posts with brackets. The house has a stone foundation with cellar; entrance is on east gable end. The cellar windows are louvered. In each gable wall is an inside end chimney. The window sash is 6/9 with pegged frames (with bead on inner edge). There are two gabled dormers in the roof which is also gable. The exterior of the building is covered with stucco. Under the eaves is a brick cornice.

The interior has chair rail in the front rooms and Federal period mantels. The rear wing is stucco over clapboard.
